Thank you for your interest in holding a food drive to benefit the Superstition Community Food Bank (SCFB).

What is a Food and Fund Drive?

A food and fund drive is an excellent opportunity for the community to partner with the Superstition Community Food Bank in our fight to end hunger. Food and Fund Drives are conducted by churches, RV parks, neighborhoods, businesses, service clubs, schools, military units, scouts, sports teams and any group of dedicated people who realize it takes local initiative to solve a local problem.

Food drives are critical to the mission of the Food Bank in collecting enough food and funds to feed individuals and families in need in East Valley communities. Most of our clients live in the city of Apache Junction but we assist anyone needing food.



Help Feed the Hungry and Get Your Money Back

The Apache Junction Reach Out Inc. dba Superstition Community Food Bank is a 501(C)(3) Qualified Charitable Organization (EIN 86-0454767 and QCO# 20221) under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code section 170 for Federal estate and gift tax purposes. Your gift qualifies as a tax credit. Unlike tax deductions, these Charitable Tax Credits are fully tax-refundable for Arizona residents; either reducing the total AZ state income tax you owe or increasing the state income tax refund you receive. Dollar for dollar when you file your taxes on AZ Department of Revenue Form 321. *Up to \$400 per individual and \$800 for couples filing a joint income tax return in the State of Arizona.

Typical cart of groceries for a family of four. Weight is approximately 125 – 150 lbs. of food and includes TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program) bags weighing on average 16 lbs. These bags contain basic staple items: canned meats, peanut butter, pasta, rice, beans, pasta sauce, mac and cheese, canned fruits and vegetables and occasionally canned meals such as chili and ravioli, if available.

FAQ's about Food and Fund Drives

Why are food and fund drive so important?

Even though we engage in several food rescue operations, many of our non-perishable food items come from food drives. Monetary donations allow us to purchase the food needed to create balanced meals.

What times of year is the Superstition Community Food Bank in most critical need of additional donations?

We always need donations and never turn them away. Food shelves are empty during the holidays and summer months when children are out of school.

What types of food are you collecting?

The shopping lists at the back of this kit and on our boxes contain our most needed items.

- We can only accept unopened items in their original packaging.
- We cannot accept home-canned goods or other foods grown at residential locations.
- Plastic boxed or canned items are best. Avoid giving glass containers.
- Check those items are still within the "use before" date.

Do you accept cash donations as well as food donations?

Yes. Funds are much needed to keep our doors open and maintain necessary staple food item supplies. The Apache Junction Reach Out Inc. is a 501(C)(3) Qualified Charitable Organization (EIN 86-0454767 and QCO# 20221) under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code section 170 for Federal estate and gift tax purposes. Your gift qualifies as a tax credit, which is fully tax-refundable in the state of Arizona. Can the SCFB pick-up my collected food?

The SCFB has limited staff and vehicles already used daily for food pick-ups from local grocers and businesses. Your delivery to the SCFB is appreciated but, if that is not possible, call us at 480-983-2995 or email info@superstitionfoodbank.org to schedule your donation pick up.

Where is the SCFB located and when is it open?

We are located at 575 N. Idaho Road, Suite 701, Apache Junction, AZ 85119-4015 (SE corner of Idaho Rd. and Superstition Blvd. We share a parking lot with the Apache Junction Motor Vehicle Division in the Roy Hudson Pinal County Complex).

We receive food donations Monday - Friday, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm, closed for lunch 12 pm - 1 pm Closed on Saturday and all state and federal holidays.

FAQ's continued:

Business Name: Apache Junction Reach Out, Inc. dba Superstition Community Food Bank - SCFB

What is food insecurity?

Food insecurity means that individuals or families are limited in their resources to buy food. Often the quantity and quality of food are impacted, resulting in cutting out meat, feeding their children unbalanced meals, or skipping meals to eat.

What is the Superstition Community Food Bank (SCFB)?

The SCFB is primarily a safety net providing food for community members who cannot make ends meet and supplement their inadequate food supplies. The SCFB is a food rescue operation working to help those in the East Valley annually. Our service area includes Ellsworth to the West, Queen Valley Rd to the East, McDowell Rd to the North and Ocotillo Rd to the South, which is a service area of approximately 100 square miles.

How does the SCFB help?

We provided free food to 14,000 eligible families 30,000 total people in 2020. Nearly a million meals are supplied, and we feed 12,000 children and about 6,800 seniors. Our clients include children, seniors, the working poor, and under-employed professionals. We spend less than 10% of our total income on administration costs, ensuring your dollars go to direct services. We also refer our families to all the agencies and social services available in the region for additional help.

How does SCFB obtain food?

The SCFB obtains much of its food through food rescue operations from retail outlets and food drives. We also receive The Emergency Food Assistance Program is brought to our warehouse, sorted by volunteers and stored in dry storage, our refrigeration stations or freezer depending upon guidelines set forth by the USDA. Food needed to fulfill the need is also purchased.

How does the SCFB accomplish meeting the needs of our community?

Volunteers are the heart and soul of the SCFB. We could not operate without the enormous donation of 18,000 hours in 2019 from approximately 279 dedicated volunteers. At \$25.43/hr. equates to \$457,740 value (https://independentsector.org/resource/vovt_details)

Organizing and Running Your Food and Fund Drive Six Easy Steps to organizing and Running Your Food and Fund Drive

1. Set your event date/goals.

Contact the SCFB at 480-983-2995 to schedule your Food/Fund Drive. No matter your approach, it helps to have a specific goal, which gives participants something to work toward and a benchmark for success. The plan can be based on the amount raised the last time or set a goal based on the number of participants.

EXAMPLES: organization with 300 people: 300 people x 5 pounds per person = 1,500 pounds

2. Start early and set up a kick-off event.

Share information throughout your organization and community to raise involvement early in the process. Make posters, flyers and signs to promote your drive. You can also remind people about your food drive in your email signature or voicemail message. Suppose your organization has a website, post the information about your food drive on it. During the Food and Fund Drive, keep everyone updated on its progress. Invite an SCFB Board Member or Volunteer to educate your participants about hunger and how to alleviate it.

3. Set up a central location.

Collection sites should be visible and easy to find. Collect donated food and grocery items at central locations like break rooms, shared meeting rooms and reception areas. Assign one or two individuals to be responsible for collecting financial contributions.

4. Get food boxes and containers.

The SCFB can provide large boxes for food collection. Items most needed are already imprinted on the boxes.

5. Food drive donation boxes or donation drop off.

Please contact SCFB at 480-983-2995 in advance to ensure someone is available to provide you collection boxes and that you come during the hours we are open, listed on the previous page.

6. Inquire if your company or a local company will do a matching financial gift.

Many companies are happy to make a matching gift of their employee contributions – even when they give food instead of cash. Inquire if your company will donate a dollar for every pound of food raised. If your school, church, local community organization, or local club is holding the Food and Fund Drive, consider asking friends, relatives, or local companies to do a matching gift.

Sample Letter

[Our organization] is holding a Food and Fund Drive on [DATES] to benefit the Superstition Community Food Bank, a local non-profit providing food to qualifying families in the East Valley. All food and funds raised will help the SCFB supply emergency food to those in need and refer them to other services.

You probably have a neighbor, friend or family member who has little left for food after rent, medical costs, clothing and other expenses are paid monthly. The quantity and quality of food can mean unbalanced or skipped meals. Children and seniors are often impacted the most.

Hunger statistics in our community:

- In 2020, SCFB gave out nearly one million pounds of food to 30,000 people.
- 1 in 5 adults in Arizona lives below the federal poverty level. 1 in 4 children and 1 in 7 seniors are food insecure.

Here's How You Can Help:

1. Donate non-perishable foods in the marked boxes at collection points in our location:
